PERMITTED AND PROHIBITED TO BE CARRIED IN HAND LUGGAGE

Jorge Chavez International
Airport





This list is not exhaustive.
Therefore, **security personnel are authorized to classify as prohibited any other item that may pose a risk** to aviation security, aircraft operational safety, passengers, crew members, airport facilities, or the public.

CATEGORIES

Items not expressly listed in this document include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Devices capable of discharging a projectile or causing injury, or that appear capable of doing so.
2. Devices specifically designed to incapacitate or immobilize.
3. Items that may be used as weapons, including sharp or edged objects capable of causing injury.
4. Blunt objects capable of causing injury.
5. Chemical or toxic substances that pose a risk to passenger and crew health, aircraft safety, or property.
6. Explosive or flammable substances that pose a risk to passenger and crew health, aircraft safety, or property.
7. Gaseous objects or various substances that could be used to carry out an act of unlawful interference.
8. Any other item manufactured or adapted to cause injury, incapacitate a person, or damage or destroy physical facilities.
9. Substances that may endanger aircraft operational safety, passengers, facilities, or the public.

CATEGORY

ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

List of Items Permitted and Prohibited - **Electronic Equipment**

PERMITTED



Video cameras, cameras, digital cameras, portable video players, mobile phones and GPS devices.



Laptops, notebooks, electronic gaming consoles, tablets, etc.



*Passengers are advised to keep fragile or valuable electronic equipment in their hand luggage when passing through security screening. Consult your airline regarding restrictions on the use of electronic devices during the flight.

CATEGORY

**WEAPONS, FIREARMS,
DEFENSIVE ITEMS,
AMMUNITION AND
EXPLOSIVES**

List of Items Permitted and Prohibited - **Weapons, Firearms, Defensive Items, Ammunition and Explosives**

PROHIBITED



Firearms

(Including blank-firing guns, revolvers and shotguns, replicas and toy guns with realistic appearance), signal flare guns and ammunition of any caliber.

Firearm parts, including realistic replicas.
(Scopes and telescopic sights are excluded.)



Stunning Devices

Stun guns, Tasers or stun batons, animal stun devices, chemical products, gases and neutralizing or incapacitating sprays, such as mace, pepper spray, tear gas, acid sprays and animal repellent aerosols.



Plastic Explosives

C4, Semtex, gunpowder, detonators, dynamite, Molotov cocktails, explosive or incendiary devices, pyrotechnic articles, nitroglycerin.



Explosive and Incendiary Substances and Devices

Ammunition, blasting caps, detonators and fuses, replicas or imitations of explosive devices, mines, grenades and other military-grade explosive charges, fireworks and other pyrotechnic articles, smoke bombs and smoke-generating cartridges, dynamite, gunpowder, plastic explosives, slow fuse and fast fuse.



Bladed Weapons

Axes, brass knuckles, telescopic batons, batons, slings, spiked wristbands, clubs, martial arts weapons, swords, sabers, foils, knives, arrows (for sporting use), darts, spears and fishing harpoons. (Even if handmade or intended for sporting use.)



Blowguns

(without darts).

Bows or Crossbows

(without arrows and/or darts).



Air guns and their ammunition.

PERMITTED



Handcuffs.

CATEGORY

FOOD AND BEVERAGES

PERMITTED



Non-Alcoholic Beverages

Yogurts, whipped cream, condensed milk, cream cheese, canned soups, canned foods, jams, liquid or paste seasonings.



Baby Food

Infant formula, juices and other baby food may be carried through the inspection checkpoint and taken on board the aircraft.



Alcoholic Beverages

When in retail packaging containing more than 24% but less than 70% alcohol by volume, in containers not exceeding 5 liters, with a total net quantity of 5 liters per person.



Homemade Liquids

Security personnel may request the passenger to taste or apply the homemade liquid to their skin, as applicable, in order to verify the authenticity of the product. The presence of the Peruvian National Police may be requested.



Meat, Fish, Shrimp, Seafood, etc.

Consult your airline regarding packaging instructions or requirements for these items.



Cookies, fruit, candies, dried fruit, pudding, sandwiches.



*Security personnel are authorized to apply additional security measures.

CATEGORY

PERSONAL ITEMS

PERMITTED



Lithium-ion batteries

Batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits. Electronic devices containing these batteries may be carried in carry-on baggage subject to the following conditions:

- Batteries with a watt-hour rating of 100 Wh or less are permitted.
- Batteries with a watt-hour rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh, for consumer electronic devices, are permitted with the airline's approval.
- **Batteries exceeding 160 Wh are prohibited.**

No more than two batteries per passenger are permitted in carry-on baggage. For further information, please refer to IATA Table 2.3.A.

To convert ampere-hours (Ah) to watt-hours (Wh), multiply Ah × voltage.



Urns with Ashes

The urn will be inspected using X-ray screening equipment. Additional security measures may be applied if necessary.



Umbrellas, Parasols, Walking Canes

Permitted through inspection checkpoints, provided they are presented to the security officer for inspection and do not contain any prohibited items.



Personal Hygiene Items

Shampoo, conditioner, liquid soap, moisturizing cream, facial cleansing creams, hair gel, insect repellent (stick, cream or gel), lipstick, lip gloss or lip balm, ointments, face masks, makeup remover, mouthwash, shaving cream, toothpaste, tanning lotion, sunscreen, gel deodorant, eye drops, contact lens solution.

Medicinal or toiletry items (including aerosols) such as hair spray, perfumes, colognes, deodorants, aerosol insect repellent, acetone, nail polish, Florida water, medicinal alcohol and medicines containing alcohol.



Nail Files, Letter Openers, Tweezers, Cuticle Trimmers, Pointed Metal or Wooden Hair or Clothing Accessories

(Length equal to or less than 6 cm).



Razors and Replacement Cartridges

Provided they are enclosed in their plastic packaging. Cigar cutters and barber razors (provided they do not contain a cutting blade).

PROHIBITED



Corkscrews, Can Openers or Letter Openers

With a blade length greater than 6 cm.

CATEGORY

TOOLS AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS

PROHIBITED



Bleach, chlorine, muriatic acid, paints, insecticides, pesticides and poisons.



Fire extinguishers, fire pokers, bolt cutters, plastering trowels.



Box cutters, knives, blades, automatic knives, pointed table knives, including ceremonial knives, with metal blades or any other durable material that allows their use as a weapon.



Hammers, saw blades or hand saws, axes, chisels, drills, drill bits, staple guns, blowtorches, plumb bobs, ice picks, punches.



Pointed potato peelers.

PERMITTED



Wrenches

Open-end, box-end or combination wrenches; hex keys or Allen keys; adjustable wrenches; pipe wrenches up to 10 cm in length.



Contact Adhesive

For personal use only, in blister packaging (one blister per passenger).



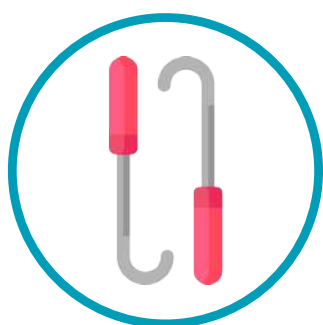
Musical Instruments

Consult your airline regarding any restrictions that may apply to the transport of musical instruments in the aircraft cabin.



Sharp Objects

Scissors with blade length less than 6 cm, tools with blade length less than or equal to 6 cm, and nail clippers with a blade length less than or equal to 6 cm.



Knitting needles, crochet hooks, forks.



Blender blades.

CATEGORY

MEDICATIONS AND MEDICAL DEVICES

PROHIBITED



Portable Oxygen Cylinders

Except when required for the passenger’s medical use. Must not exceed 5 kg gross weight. Authorization from your airline is required.



Clinical Thermometers

Thermometers containing mercury.



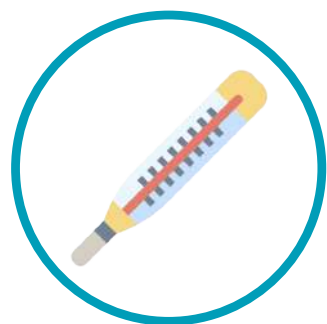
Scalpels

PERMITTED



Supplies for People with Diabetes

- Supplies for the treatment and control of diabetes, such as syringes, insulin auto-injectors and insulin pumps, are permitted through inspection checkpoints.
- Syringes must be for personal medical use and the needle must be kept in its protective case.
- The passenger must carry the medication to be administered using the syringe.
- Insulin is exempt from liquid restrictions.



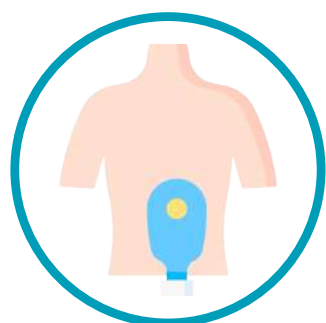
Mercury or Digital Thermometers or Barometers

Permitted only when transported by a representative of a government meteorological agency.
Example: SENAMHI, Peruvian Navy Hydrography Service, CORPAC, etc.



Wheelchairs

And other battery-powered mobility aids.
Authorization from your airline is required.



Colostomy Bags



Dental Instruments



Medical Reflex Hammers



Bandage Scissors



Hypodermic Syringes



Cough Syrup

CATEGORY

SPORTS AND CAMPING ITEMS

List of Prohibited and Permitted Items – *Sports and Camping Items*

PROHIBITED



Billiard cues, golf clubs, hockey sticks, lacrosse sticks, skis, baseball bats, cricket bats, weights and dumbbells.



Camping Stoves
containing flammable liquids.



Bowling balls, shot puts and hammers.

PERMITTED



Avalanche Rescue Backpacks
Airline authorization is required.



New Camping Stoves
Provided they do not contain or show evidence of flammable liquids or gas cylinders.



Compressed Air Cartridges
A maximum of four cartridges, each not exceeding 28 grams (50 ml).



Tennis rackets, fishing hooks and fishing rods.



Scissors, Tools, Nail Clippers, Compasses
With a blade length of less than 6 cm, measured from the point where the two blades join to the tip of one blade.

CATEGORY

LIGHTERS AND FLAMMABLE MATERIAL

PROHIBITED



Universal ignition matches.



Flammable liquids.



Torch-type lighters - fine flame.

PERMITTED



Disposable Lighters and Zippo-type Lighters

Permitted provided the passenger carries them on their person, with a maximum of one per person. Electronic cigarettes are also permitted under the same condition.



Safety Matches

Permitted provided the passenger carries them on their person, with a maximum of one per person.



When the **risk level is classified as HIGH or SEVERE**, as determined by the Civil Aviation Authority (DGAC) or Lima Airport, and based on the provisions established in the security program, the rules regarding certain items are modified as follows:

PROHIBITED



Scissors of any length.



Knives, blender blades, razors, multi-purpose knives and other sharp or pointed objects of any length.



Tools of any size, except those required for assembling mobility assistance equipment.



Lighters and safety matches.
